


Partnership





Qualifications for Scholarship

Is or has been in state custody (foster care)
Has or has had a CASA or GAL volunteer
Be nominated by a CASA/GAL volunteer or CASA/GAL program staff
Has graduated from or is scheduled to graduate from an accredited school system, o has received or is scheduled to receive their GED by this spring, 2021
Is currently applying to be accepted, has been accepted or is currently enrolled at an accredited institute of higher learning
Be and remain in good academic standing

Application Requirements

- Online application form (completed and submitted by nominator)
- Letter of recommendation from nominator.
- Second letter of recommendation
- Timeline of nominee's experience in state custody/foster care
- Nominee's educational information
- Transcripts from nominee's educational institution(s)
- Responses for Nominee Narrative section
- Nominee's personal essay



Letters of Recommendation

Letters should highlight the nominee's strengths in these areas:

- Scholarship: academic growth or success
- Service: accomplishments in areas of individual and community engagement
- Mentorship
- Leadership
- Extracurricular activities
- Employment

Letters of recommendation must be typed, signed and submitted as a Word (.doc) or PDF file.

Nominee's Personal Essay

The essay is an opportunity for the nominee to share their personal story, including values, barriers encountered and future hopes and dreams. Nominees must submit a written essay and have the option of including an additional video essay.

Suggested topics:

- Reason for entering foster care
- Successes and challenges encountered
- Greatest barriers to success
- People who have been inspirations
- Personal strengths and motivators

Akerman Academic Excellence Scholarship CASA GAL Court Appointed Special Advocates Gurd Appointed

Established through an endowment by Akerman LLP, the Akerman Academic Excellence Scholarship was created to help young adults who have spent time in foster care pursue a higher education through an accredited institute of higher learning such as a university, a career college, or technical school. In June 2020, a scholarship for \$2,500 will be awarded to an outstanding youth who has been or is currently in foster care and has demonstrated a commitment to academic achievement.

The scholarship recipient must be a full-time student in good academic standing in order to receive scholarship funds (e.g. cumulative G.P.A. above 2.0 at the end of the Spring semester of each academic year). Scholarship funds will be directed to the academic institution or other professional entity on behalf of the scholarship recipient to be used towards books, registration costs, transportation to school, meal plans, and other related expenses. Scholarship recipients who remain in good academic standing and meet any additional requirements may be eligible to receive the scholarship for up to four years.

Applicants are identified and nominated by their CASA/GAL program through an advocate or another program representative. Nominators are required to complete the nomination form and submit all requisite documentation. Applications will be evaluated by a Scholarship Selection Committee that will include CASA/GAL and Akerman representatives, who will select the scholarship recipient.


