April 30 - May 1, 2022

Goals: To raise awareness and support for National CASA/GAL. To share information about our mission and the importance of volunteers across our network of state organizations and local programs through a unified national event.







2021 Highlights

- Inaugural event launched in May 2021.
- Nearly 2,000 participants from all 50 states and the District of Columbia.
- Very visible promotion throughout the event weekend, with many stories and photos shared by individuals across social media.
- Introduced new supporters to our mission through event participation.
- Several organized groups of CASA/GAL staff and volunteers participating together.
